History of Y'sDom - Southeast Asia Region



Following at the end of the war with Japan in 1945, internal warfare continued to disrupt the activities of YMCA and Y's Men's Club in China so that by 1949 all official activity of Y'sdom in Mainland China had ceased, even as the other clubs outside of China continue to operate. Thus, the Y's Men Chinese Region eventually became the Southeast Asia Region in 1961 at the Chicago International Convention. The Region is diverse with a spread of 3 districts, 39 clubs and over 500 members nowadays including Hong Kong, Macau, Singapore, Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia, Cambodia, Nepal and Myanmar with different races, languages, religions and cultures.

How clubs in Hong Kong supported Wong Yi Chau Youth Camp



During the 1960s, The Chinese YMCA of Hong Kong actively searched for land to build another new camp to meet the needs of the community, and finally obtained the government's permission to expand the association's second camp on a small island outside Sai Kung (Wong Yi Chau) with an area of about 10 acres. In June 1965, Y's Men's Club of Hong Kong donated 100,000 Hong Kong dollars (US\$12,820) to the initial costs of the camp site which supported the construction, and thus the camp was named "Y's Men YMCA Wong Yi Chau Youth Camp".

In 1972, the Y's Men's Club of Hong Kong together with other clubs in the district including the Victoria, Kowloon, Tsuen Wan and Peninsular clubs organized a Jubilee Ball in celebrating the 50th Anniversary of Y's Men International. As a token of commemoration, a "Y's Men Village" consisting of a few boarding houses was donated to the YMCA Youth Camp.

During the 1980s, a few more clubs were chartered including Island South and Bauhinia clubs joining the donation to support other facilities on the camp site. Clubs generously donated \$250,000 Hong Kong Dollars (US\$32050) to cover half of the construction cost of a two-storey integrated activity centre near the pier and recreation rooms on the left and right sides, which was presided over by the Hon.D. Akers-Jones, C.M.G. J.P., the Secretary for City & New Territories Administration on April 23, 1983. In addition, in 1989, the Government approved the Chinese YMCA to build additional facilities in the north of the island, and was again sponsored by the Y's Men's Club of Hong Kong, the Rotary Club of Hong Kong North and the Sir David Trench Fund Committee to build facilities such as the roundabout jogging track physical training facility, camping area, rope net array and archery range. In the 1990s, a number of development projects were carried out on the camp, including an amphitheatre, water sports area and pier. In addition to outdoor activities such as different ball games, camping areas and campfires, the camp also provides a variety of water activities, such as dragon boating, cockpit less canoeing, stand-up boarding, floating rafting, etc.

As a Regional Director, I have carried out my responsibilities with a focus on service, transparency, and the overall interests of the Region. Throughout the year, I worked to strengthen interdistrict collaboration, improve administrative clarity, enhance communication channels, and introduce more efficient practices to support the operations and development of each district.

In the term of 2025/26, the Southeast Asia Region is still facing a challenge on the membership growth & engagement, only Hong Kong District has slightly 2.6% membership growth while nearly half of the clubs in both Nepal & SMIT district failed to report membership. Y's Men's of Ipoh Club & Y Service Club of Johor Eagle in SMIT District were officially closed and more clubs are expected to be de-charter soon due to long outstanding. However, with the initiative by IP Edward Ong, one new club charter with 15 young members is being processed in Singapore recently. It was happy to see the Region has more new blood and vibrant.

Overall, the Region can manage to keep the momentum on meeting and trainings. Other than regular Troika meetings, three Regional Board Meetings were conducted on August 16, 2025, December 13, 2025 and March 21, 2026 respectively. Moreover, there were two regional trainings organized for District Governors and Regional Service Directors. The first one was leadership training on October 25, 2025 focusing on the role & job duties of DGs & RSDs while the second one was a Practical Training – How to apply AI on clubs on November 22, 2025.

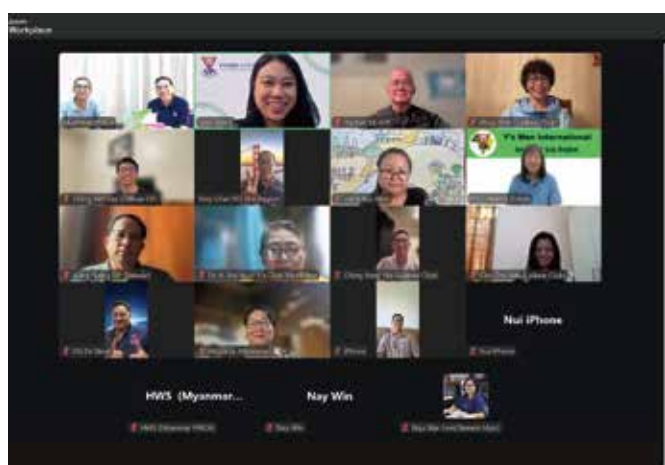

Acting DG's Report to 92nd Southeast Asia Regional Conference

SMIT is a diverse district, with 15 clubs as at January 2026 spanning 7 countries within Southeast Asia and South Asia – Singapore, Malaysia, Myanmar, Indonesia, Thailand, Cambodia and Nepal.

Two clubs in Malaysia closed by the end of 2025: a young Johor Eagles Club and the Ipoh Club, which was one of the oldest clubs in SMIT. There is serious need for renewal of membership across all clubs.

Very few clubs are in “good standing” under YMI rules: these are Alpha and Beta Chapters in Singapore, Chiangmai and Bangkok Metropolitan in Thailand, Loikaw Club in Myanmar and Silver State in Malaysia. This affected the election process for the DG position in 2025. Repeated attempts to elect a DGE failed. With the resignation of previous DG Dr Steve Kok from Bangkok Club in December 2025, the post would become vacant, and I stepped in on an urgent basis as Acting DG and chaired the Nominations Committee until a new candidate could be found. With the support of the Committee Members comprising PAP David Lua, APE Rachan Maneekarn, IPRD Helena Cheah and PRD Patricia Lim, I am thankful that Y's Man Wayne Soo, current President of Beta Chapter, was successfully elected as DGE. He takes over from me on 1 July 2026.

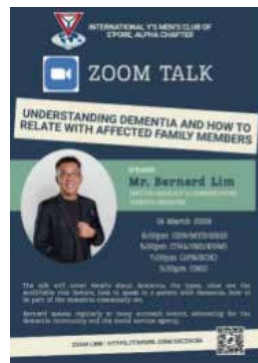

Despite having small memberships, many clubs had undertaken significant community service projects. We are encouraged by the efforts of the Y's Men Clubs in Chiangrai, Malang, Mandalay, KL Berbakti and others to serve the poor and needy, and those caught in natural disasters. 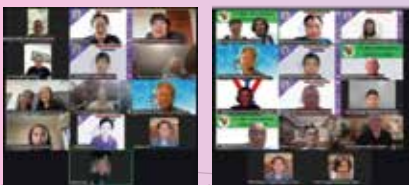

Introduction

In 2024, at the International YMI Convention in Chiang Mai, I had the privilege of delivering a keynote address, unaware that I would later be elected International President of this great movement. I spoke about “Blue Music,” a powerful metaphor for change, imagination, inclusion, freedom and hope. Our vision for 2026/27 is inspired by Blue Music.

What Defines YMI?

Our acts of goodness, empathy, kindness, love, and giving without expecting anything in return define our movement.

This is what the world needs most.
This is what tyrants fear most.
This is the greatest force for good on earth.

Mahatma Gandhi challenged an empire armed only with goodness.
Martin Luther King Jr. confronted injustice through peace and moral courage.
Nelson Mandela overcame apartheid with justice and steadfast resolve.

History reminds us: Goodness is Power. Humanity desperately needs Goodness in Action.
This is what drives us forward.

IP Theme: Waking the Sleeping Giant with Blue Music

The Giant is YMI itself — its clubs, its people, its experience, its wisdom, its history, its global reach, and its moral strength.

This Giant is powerful. Yet too often, it sleeps — not from weakness, but from forgetting the strength of the goodness within us and the difference we can make in the world through fellowship and service.

In 2026/27, we are called to awaken every club and every club member.

Not with force.
Not with authority.
But with Blue Music.





Blue Music is the eternal music of humanity — love, humour, empathy, courage, creativity, freedom and care. It is the music born around campfires, where people gathered for fellowship and hope, not domination or fear. It is the freedom to choose your own destiny !.

It stands in contrast to the grey music of conflict, domination , stagnation, and division.

Blue Music brings renewal.
Blue Music brings joy.
Blue Music brings life.

Without it, organisations grow rigid.
With it, they flourish.

Blue Music is not only a philosophy for YMI — it is a way of life driven by core values. It means joyful fellowship, inclusive leadership, creative service initiatives, intergenerational engagement, and courageous compassion in action.

In the era of Artificial Intelligence, YMI leverages the power of Blue Music to foster human connection, emotional well-being, and global solidarity.

Blue Music gives each club the freedom to decide what it needs, what it will do, and how it will act in support of our collective mission.

IP Slogan: YMI – Empowering Life

To empower life is to recognise value in every person — especially where the world sees weakness.

It means offering fellowship instead of mere charity.
Dignity instead of pity.
Opportunity instead of sympathy.

It means addressing loneliness across all generations through meaningful fellowship and service.

It means enabling both young and older people to live fully, contribute confidently, and serve with purpose.

As leaders and members of YMI, you are not merely managers of structure — you are conductors of Blue Music.





Create the rhythm that inspires clubs to grow.
Encourage members to serve joyfully.
Enable communities to experience hope.

Let YMI be known everywhere as a movement empowering life by doing good and spreading love.

Goals for 2026/27: The Blue Music in Action

Alongside our agreed numerical targets for membership growth, new clubs, new countries, and increased programme contributions — as agreed with APEs and RDEs — I challenge our clubs worldwide to focus on six key action areas:

1. Hold Blue Music Campfires for Change

A campfire brings people together, creating warmth, connection, and a sense of community in a simple and comforting way. Blue Music inspires us to encourage change among our club members by:

- Organising at least one “Blue Music Campfire” during the year at club level.
- Welcoming at least two new members through these gatherings.
- Creating space for storytelling, creativity, and new service ideas.
- Encouraging open dialogue about club renewal and future vision.

Share stories and photos of campfire events with IHQ. Your good stories will be shared globally, and your club’s creative actions will be recognised internationally.

2. Challenge Loneliness: Reframing Ageing as Strength

We live in an increasingly ageing world. There is a growing number of older people in our society, and many experience loneliness. Blue Music inspires us to see this as an opportunity by:

- Recruiting seniors as active club members.
- Promoting fellowship, leadership opportunities, and purposeful service for older adults.
- Celebrating and reframing ageing as a source of strength, wisdom, and experience.
- Creating inclusive spaces that bring generations together.

A club member recruiting at least three new members during the year will receive the **Blue Music Booster Award** from the IP.A club recruiting six new members will be recognised as a **Blue Music Booster Club**.



3. Fight Waste and Promote Sustainability

YMI has been fighting waste and promoting sustainability over the years. Blue Music calls us to enhance our actions to protect our planet for future generations by:

- Strengthening and promoting second-hand shops and encouraging the culture of buying recycled products as a lifestyle.
- Organising 100 local clean-up campaigns at club and district levels.
- Training volunteer teams and engaging the public to expand environmental impact.

Share your good stories with IHQ and be nominated for the **Blue Music Sustainability Award**.

4. Fight Malaria & Support International Programmes

Malaria continues to kill millions of people every year. YMI has been combating this deadly disease with our partners. However, fundraising for Roll Back Malaria (RBM), as well as other international programmes such as ASF, TOF, and BF, has been declining in recent years. Blue Music inspires us to reverse this trend by:

- Increasing fundraising for Roll Back Malaria (RBM) and all other international programmes — Alexander Support Fund (ASF), Building Fellowship (BF), Time of Fast (TOF), etc.
- Providing virtual fundraising training for RSDs and ASDs.
- Organising regional fundraising campaigns for international projects and programmes.
- Recognising and celebrating fundraising achievements.

Regions achieving their fundraising goals for international programmes will be awarded the **Blue Music Fundraising Award** from the International President.

5. Strengthen Collaboration with YMCA

YMI was founded as a service club to the YMCA, and we have journeyed together for over a century. Our collaboration model must remain relevant in changing times so that we can make a stronger impact in society and help our movements grow. Blue Music inspires us to strengthen YMI–YMCA collaboration by:

- Carrying out 100 community initiatives jointly led by YMI Clubs and YMCA around the world.
- Organise at least 20 formal regional consultations between YMCA and YMI leaders to deepen cooperation and foster a dynamic, win-win relationship that strengthens both movements.



- Promoting targeted communication to encourage and strengthen YMI/YMCA partnerships.
- Encouraging joint service projects and shared community impact.

The best YMI–YMCA collaborations at club, region, and area levels will be recognised internationally.

6. Expand Local Community Service

Community service is the heart and spirit of every club member.

Each community has unique needs, and it is our responsibility to respond with compassion, dedication, and action. Blue Music inspires us to expand our local community service efforts and create lasting impact by reaching more people, sharing hope, and strengthening the bonds that unite us:

- Achieving 1,000 local community service initiatives at club level.
- Increasing youth and intergenerational participation in community action.
- Ensuring all service projects reflect the true spirit of “Goodness in Action.”

Together, we can shape a vibrant, purposeful, and inspiring movement for all generations using the power of goodness.
